The Sacramento-Tahoe Chapter of the Society of American Forester's has a \$500 Scholarship available to assist area students who plan to obtain a degree in Forestry from an SAF Accredited four year program.

Students can be graduating high school students, community college students, or students already enrolled in a four year program leading to a B.S. degree in Forestry or a closely related field. Priority will be given to students who have just enrolled in the program. However, returning students are welcome to apply.

The deadline for applications is July 1, 2008 and the scholarship awarded by August 1, 2008 for the Fall 2008 school term. The funds will be awarded following proof of enrollment for the Fall 2008 terms. Unsuccessful applicants may resubmit their application in 2009.

- 1) Please provide your first and last name with your current address, current phone number and email if applicable. Please include phone number where you are available during the normal work day and the evening.
- 2) Forestry Classes: Below please list all Forestry or natural resource classes that you have completed or in which you are currently enrolled. Please provide the course subject, institution attended, and date completed, or enrolled for current classes.
- 3) Technical Experience: List all technical experience you have had in the field of forestry or closely related fields including fire protection, biology, botany, or range management. Provide the name, address, and phone number of the employer, brief description of job duties, and dates of employment.
- 4) Awards or Certificates: List any awards or certificates for efforts made in the area of forestry or closely related fields including fire protection, biology, botany, range management. Provide the name of the award, purpose of award, and date received.
- 5) Organization Memberships: List Student and Professional organizations in which you have involvement. Provide a brief statement for each describing your activities in the organization.
- 6) Personal Interest: Attach an essay of sufficient length to describe your reasons for entering into the field of forestry and how you would utilize this scholarship for the improvement of your career and the profession of forestry.
- 7) Letter(s) of Support: Submit a letter from a counselor, instructor, or employer supporting your application for the scholarship. Note: This letter can be submitted separately as long as it is received prior to the deadline for submitting the application as indicated on the Announcement.
